It is important that the Town of Ross protect its residents from harmful projects proposed and under construction by the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District ("District). The projects of immediate concern are: The San Anselmo Flood Risk Reduction Project (SAFRR) and the Corte Madera Creek Flood Risk Management Project (CMC). Both projects require FEMA approval and review which they currently lack.

Homeowner Hardships – The District has been unable to provide mitigation plans for properties impacted by the SAFRR project, and the uncertainty has had a stressful and detrimental impact on me and my family. The CMC project will also require mitigation and this will add uncertainty to the lives of more members of the Ross Community. Since the District refuses to cooperate and work with existing homeowners, I hope the Town Council will take action. We appreciate that the Town of Ross understands this troubling situation.

To that end, Ross Councilmember Elizabeth Brekhus correctly told the Marin IJ, on March 20, 2023 that:

"It's been very hard and unfair to our residents to live with this project for so long without being told what the mitigation is... at if the owners of the 20 properties decide to sell, they would have to disclose that there is a "cloud" hanging over their parcels."

Like my neighbors, I have considered selling my home of more than 25 years, but having that "cloud of disclosure" hanging over it and likely selling at a huge discount has made us all feel trapped.

We fully appreciate Councilmember Brekhus putting this on the record as we have been trapped for at least 6 years, and still counting. (Note: 20 Winship Ave. directly across the creek from me sold at a steep discount in 2019, and again in 2021 losing hundreds of thousands of dollars and had to provide more than 250 pages of disclosures).

In a sympathetic email, dated January 8, 2024 addressed to me, Ross Town Manager Christa Johnson also shows she understands this distress as she wrote:

"I am very sorry about the distress the County's project and communication efforts have caused you and your neighbors. It must be very stressful to endure this uncertainty for such a long period of time. Please be assured that the Ross Town Council and Town Staff are taking this seriously. We are spending many hours trying to understand what the County is doing, potential impacts to the Ross

community, and what the Town is able to do. I am not able to provide you with a solution right now but I want you to know that your concerns have been acknowledged by the Town.``
